**2009 Festival Theme**  
**“Tall Trees and Shining Seas”**

**Eligibility:** Young Artists who have taken Art Classes sponsored by the Manley Art Center and Gallery within the last two years or private lessons. Ages vary between 6 and 14 years.

**Rules must be followed exactly to be eligible to enter this Art Show.**

1. All artwork must be done by the children and be original art, no photocopies or reproductions of any kind will be allowed.
2. Accepted artwork must be \* framed behind glass and have screw eyes and wire on the back for secure hanging. No tabs or hooks of any kind will be allowed.
3. All artwork must be created in the last two years and be fresh, new and ready for hanging upon arrival.
4. All artwork entering the show must be delivered to Azalea Middle School Gym between 4:00 - 6:00 PM on Friday, May 22nd.
5. A label of the artist's name, address and phone number, title of piece, medium used, and price if for sale, or NFS (not for sale) must be on the back.
6. No art will be released early before closing on Sunday at 5:00 PM. Art must be picked up on Sunday before 6 PM, or pay a rental fee to the gallery for holding it overtime.
7. Children's Art Registration Forms are available at the Manley Art Center and must be presented at registration. There is an entry fee of \$5.00 per piece at registration, due no later than Thursday May 21, 2009 with filled out forms. **Do NOT bring your art to registration.** Checks are payable to PBAA or Manley Art Center and Gallery.
8. There will be a 15% commission on all sales of children's art submitted.
9. Ribbons will be presented by judges. No monetary prizes will be awarded in the children's art category this year.

\* As a side note, the framing can be expensive and there are many ways to do this. Fred Meyer's has frames that have the mat and glass in them already and that is the cheapest way to go. I know WalMart has frames also or if you travel you can go to Michaels, Costco or other supply type stores. Take the painting with you so you will know the correct size to buy. A picture is framed properly by matting it first which adds a couple of inches on all sides to the picture before you frame it. Some frames come with the mat included. You will have to purchase screw eyes and pictures framing wire also and put that on yourself. If you wish to have it done professionally, you can visit the The Wright's Frame Shop in the (Ben Franklin's store) in Crescent City and **now in Brookings** too. Ask them to help you pick the right mat and frame to make your picture look spectacular. You may have them do it for you or just purchase all the supplies and put it together yourself at home. It will be preserved for many years if done properly. Remember these art pieces may be sold!!!

If you need help or have any questions please contact me. I will be glad to walk you through the process of framing and matting to make it a less expensive process for you. I have matted most of my own now that I know how.
