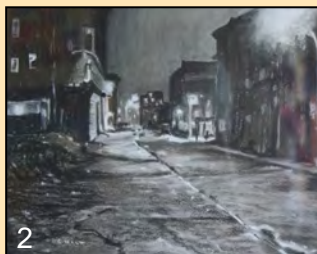

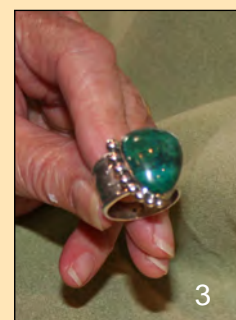

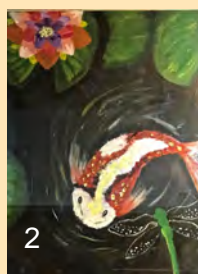

We're Having a Hootenanny



What's a Hootenanny?

Well, I had to ask that question also. I found it defined as a gathering of people playing folk-music and singing along.

In our September event we had nine people playing at least seven different types of instruments. It was difficult to keep track because several people would be playing one thing and the next time I looked they were playing something else. Some of them were new to me. The bozuki on the left, inlaid with mother of pearl and purchased in Greece, is simply the most beautiful instrument I have ever seen.

Below that, is sort of a one-sided drum, called a bodhran. There were also guitars, a ukulele, banjo, fiddle, and even a penny whistle, all played with delightful enthusiasm and skill.

The books used by the musicians also contained the words to the songs and were passed out to the audience with an encouragement to sing along.

Nancy Sander had set up a table of nibbles and we simply sat, sang and enjoyed everything about the session. I'm not sure what I expected it to be, but I think "rowdy" was in there somewhere. It wasn't that. It was laid-back cool. A relaxing, fun experience and a great way to spend a Sunday afternoon. I am so glad I went.

There is another one scheduled for the Oct. 14th. The plan is to hold them each second Sunday of the month, so watch for news of it.

I asked Sharon about her work and and this was her response.

"I drill agates after I've tumbled them, or Lowell has sliced them into slabs. I make beads from wire also. I'm passionate about creating with metal. I use sterling silver, and copper. Using fire and forming tools takes metal to another dimension. I also enjoy working with Niobium--a reactive metal--Element #41; it is very exciting to see color changes when passing an electrical current through it--a process called anodizing."

Samples of Sharon's work here are; Earrings, made of are vintage Peking glass cone beads with enameled silver plate, and sterling silver shell charms. The green stone bracelet is of Russian Amazonite, tiny turquoise beads and moonstone.

Ukulele Lessons



The Ukulele originated in the 19th century as a Hawaiian adaptation of the Portuguese machete, a small guitar-like instrument, which was introduced to Hawaii by Portuguese immigrants.

Jenny Rosa is a Ukulele enthusiast who wants to share the fun of playing the instrument and to that end she is willing to teach you how to do it. Lessons are at the Gallery, Wednesdays between 2:00 and 3:00. Open to all ages; first lesson is free and is usually one-on-one. Call Gallery for reservation 707-460-1414
